Q: How do I apply for the program?

Q: How long does the application process take?

A: 4 – 6 weeks

Q: If I turn in my application 4 -6 weeks before a semester begins can I still register for classes for that upcoming semester?

A: Yes, as long as your application is fully processed before the semester begins. Registration for classes will be open till the end of the first week of courses.

- If you apply after the following dates for a particular semester you will be charged an additional fee.
 - Fall semester: July 20
 - Spring semester: December 20
 - Summer semester: May 20

Q: What is the application Fee?

A: A \$35 non-refundable application fee is required of all first-time applicants applying for admission to the Graduate College.

*If you are applying for [readmission](#) and have completed classes at MSU as a graduate student, you are not required to submit a fee.

Q: What qualifications are required to be considered?

1. Official undergraduate degree documentations (official transcripts)

2. Official GMAT or GRE scores**
3. Completed statement of purpose form
4. Professional resume that displays job responsibilities, relevant experience, and education history
