



Dr. Gebken challenges all of his students to reach their highest potential and encourages them to be engaged in student organizations and their studies. He also strives to be a great mentor to his students. Dr. Gebken, along with other faculty of TCM, has an active involvement in the Construction Club, Construction Management Advisory Board, and ACCE Accreditation.

Dr. Gebken has taught numerous courses within the department primarily in upper division and graduatelevel classes. Some examples include construction contracts, specifications, & law, electrical systems for buildings, construction project administration, cost management, surveying, and project management. Alumni Spotlight: Austin Leonard

ustin graduated from Missouri State University with a Bachelor's Degree in Construction Management in December 2013. For the past three years he has worked for Hensel Phelps in Florida and is currently a Project Engineer.

Austin began his career with Hensel Phelps on the Navy Federal Credit Union (NFCU) Phase 1 Expansion project in Pensacola, Florida and has recently been assigned to the Navy Federal Credit Union Phase 2 Expansion project. The \$526 million NFCU Phase 2 Expansion project consists of two seven story office buildings, a three story amenities building, and two six story parking garages. It also includes additions to the existing Central Energy Plant and associated connecting bridges, roads,

walking paths, storm water retention and infrastructure. The gross square footage of the project totals more than 2.7 million square feet of work.

As a Project Engineer, Austin is in charge of the onsite project administration of the contracts to which he is assigned. He is highly skilled in cost control, submittal coordination, MEP coordination, expediting material deliveries, subcontractor management, negotiating changes, scheduling, and general administrative operations. Recognized in the industry for his ability to isolate and resolve various design and compliance issues early in a project's evolution, Austin's aptitude and expertise are evidenced in the successful projects that he has been involved with at Hensel Phelps.
