

Comprehensive Program Exam:

Successful completion of a comprehensive examination is one of the final steps toward earning the Master of Science in Project Management degree with seminar option. To be eligible for the examination, the student must have completed all core courses for the program. The exam is in multiple choice format and will take questions from topics addressed in the six required courses. This exam is used to gauge the effectiveness of effectiveness of both the teaching in the program as well as student comprehension.

It is advisable for students to keep notes, books and syllabus for each course. Students should review the main ideas and course objectives from each course. Some useful review techniques include re-reading class notes and PowerPoints; making an outline of main concepts from each course; preparing a glossary of key terms, theories and ideas.

Exam Proctoring:

Kryterion – All students in online classes will have one major proctored exam in each course. Proctoring for these exams is provided by Kryterion. Students will create an account at the Missouri State University Portal Page for Kryterion.

Students will be required to log in and register for the exam at least 48 hours in advance. When you've logged in and chosen the correct exam, one of the online proctors will be waiting to complete the verification process. You will be required to have a webcam and microphone. The proctor will verify your ID by having you hold up a valid ID up to the camera. You will also be asked to answer a few security questions to verify that you are the correct person taking the exam. Students will be required to pay the Exam costs. Exam proctoring is a requirement for accreditation.
